# "Dads! Moms! Jesus!"



On September 6, 1995, Cal Ripken Jr. broke the one baseball record that many believed would never be broken: Lou Gehrig's ironman feat of playing in 2,131 consecutive games. Ripken gives much of the credit for his accomplishments to the example and teaching of his father Cal Ripken Sr. who played minor league baseball and coached and managed for the Orioles.

During the 1996 season Ripken Sr. was inducted into the Orioles Hall of Fame. After he gave his acceptance speech, his son Cal Jr. came to the microphone. In his book, *The Only Way I Know*, Cal Jr. recalled the emotional moment when he wrote:

It was difficult. I wasn't certain I could say what I wanted about my father and what he means to me. So, I told a

little story about my two children, Rachel, six at the time, and Ryan, then three. They'd been bickering for weeks, and I explained how one day I heard Rachel taunt Ryan, "You're just trying to be like Daddy." After a few moments of indecision, I asked Rachel, "What's wrong with trying to be like Dad?" When I finished telling the story, I looked at my father and added, "That's what I've always tried to do."

In our text for today we see that St. Paul praised the Christians at Thessalonica for being "an example to all that believe in Macedonia and Achaia." The People at Thessalonica had been worshipers of idols, but now they were imitators of Christ, role models if you will of what it means to live Christ like lives in the midst of great trial and tribulation.

Without a doubt we too, like the Thessalonians, have been called to be examples of Christ's love to others. Even though we are not intensely persecuted like many of the first Christians we still have been entrusted by God Himself to live our lives in such a way that others will not only want to imitate us but more importantly Christ Jesus.

There is a story in one of the *Chicken Soup for the Soul* books told by a mother in Costa Mesa, California. It was a hectic day in their home, she says, but with 10 children and one on the way, every day was a bit hectic. On this particular day, however, this mother was having trouble doing even routine chores — all because of one of her little boys.

Len, who was three at the time, was on her heels no matter where she went.

Whenever she stopped to do something and turned back around, she would trip over him. Several times, she patiently suggested fun activities to keep Len occupied. "Wouldn't you like to play on the swing set?" she asked again. But he simply smiled an innocent smile and said, "Oh, that's all right, Mommy, I'd rather be in here with you." Then he continued to bounce happily along behind her.

After stepping on his toes for the fifth time, Len's Mom began to lose her patience and insisted that he go outside and play with the other children. When she asked him why he was acting this way, he looked up at her with sweet green eyes and said, "Well, Mommy, in Sunday School my teacher told me to walk in Jesus' footsteps. But I can't see [Jesus], so I'm walking in yours."

And that's what it is all about, isn't it? If you don't think this is true just think about this: if the Christians at Thessalonica two thousand years ago had not been faithful under immense hardship—setting examples of sacrificial love for their neighbors — you and I might not be Christians today.

My friends, at the cross and the tomb Jesus has set the ultimate example of how we are to live out our lives and today He invites us in faith to live in such a way that when others see us they see Him and His dying love for them.


